From Pastor Kleinschmidt

In all my catechism classes, I make it a practice with the students to recite together the Evening Prayer as Martin Luther has taught us in the Small Catechism at the end of every class.

The Morning Prayer and the Evening prayer are only three sentences long, and upon close examination are identical except for the last phrases of the first sentence. The beginning and endings are exactly the same. This makes them quite easy to memorize.

These prayers begin with thanksgiving followed sa by specific petitions regarding our care as our Father's dear children throughout the immediate gratime that is before us—either sleeping or awake. These prayers with their petitions

are in accordance with God's will as recorded in his Word. Jesus teaches us to cast all your cares upon him. Jesus also tells not to worry about tomorrow, because there is plenty to concern ourselves with in the present time. What is more, we are praying to the heavenly Father just as our Lord Jesus Christ did. And according to the instructions of Jesus we are to pray to the Father through his name who gives glory to his Father and trusts him in all matters here on earth and in heaven above.

I suppose that we (at least in the United States) might think this to be the safest time to live in all of history. And I suppose compared to Luther's time with our security alarms and solid door and window locks, along with Carbon monoxide and smoke alarms, as well as, furnaces and water heaters that shut down if sensors detect a problem, we do live much more guarded lives physically. Even our cars are made with breakaway shock-reducing components and air bags to ensure a better chance for survival with little injury upon a crash. But in the spiritual realm all around us, the devil and his demons are ever as diligent to hurt and devour us as they have been in any age. During your sleep they

desire to threaten you with fear and ultimately take your life. During our wakefulness, they desire the same, but also give us plenty in this world that would occupy us and keep our hearts and minds from God. They would have us hear messages that discredit or are simply outright lies about God and his Word. Their work is to destroy our faith and trust in our heavenly Father, his redemption through his Son, Jesus Christ, and his work through the Holy Spirit to call us by the Gospel, enlighten us with His gifts, and sanctify and keep us in the true faith.

as our And so we ought pray in thankfulness for God's mediate gracious keeping—both through the night and or through the day. Through the day we pray that he would keep us from sin and every evil, so The Morning Prayer:

I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that you have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that you would keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.

I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that you have graciously kept me this day; and I pray that You would forgive me all my sins where I have done wrong, and graciously keep me this night. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.

that all our doings in life may be pleasing to God. Through the night we pray that as he has graciously kept us throughout the day that he would do so also this night. And because we sin daily, we petition him to forgive us all the sins where we have done wrong-those of which we know and those of which we do not know. With sins forgiven we then know that we have peace and a clear conscience before God.

With that, we are then bold to pray that our entire lives of

both body and soul be commended into his hands for safekeeping. We ask him to keep us from both physical and spiritual threat through the watchfulness of his mighty angels. His angels have power over demons for they are holy and have a sword of God's Word and command. In peaceful thanksgiving we gladly commend ourselves and all things to God whose will for us is served by these most holy beings. It is good to think often of them in your presence and thank God for them.

You see then what wonderful treasure we have in these prayers. Learn them and pray them and your Heavenly Father will hear and answer you. Prayerfully, Pastor Kleinschmidt
